The Baby Formula lawsuits claim that premature or preterm babies who were fed Similac or Enfamil formula while in neonatal intensive care units are at an increased risk for developing necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC).

NEC is a serious gastrointestinal condition that largely impacts premature infants. The condition involves the inflammation and ultimate death of the intestinal tissue. This condition typically develops in infants within two to six weeks after birth. It can be fatal if not quickly detected and properly treated.

Criteria

- Use of Similac or Enfamil baby formula
- Premature birth
- Born 2004 or later
- Diagnosis of NEC (necrotizing enterocolitis)
- Death
